What is Adopter Voice?

Adopter Voice is a service provided by Adoption UK, the country's largest adopter led community. Established to work with local authorities and regional adoption agencies, we contribute to and influence local change; as well as informing regional and national adoption leadership boards, and the Department for Education on policy improvements.

By bringing the experiences of adopters together we can form a stronger alliance that is able to inform decision and policy makers creating a better life for adopted children and their families.

Message from Anita Adopter Voice started at the same time the development of Regional Adoption Agencies were taking shape; I am very proud that the core service of creating Adopter Advisory Boards started in the Midlands and has grown other partnerships across England. Adopter Voice is the independent engagement tool for RAA's to really hear and value the views of their adopters and shape their services with them in mind. We aim to influence at a local level as well as national through the Adopter Reference Group; identify what support adopters are asking for in the services they receive and connect families with others as their RAA to share their voice.

What themes have been discussed through Adopter Voice?

Adopter Voice uses Champions to seek the lived experience of adopters, to share their views with local authorities & regional adoption agencies. This can take place in a variety of ways through Open Forums, Adopter Advisory Boards and Champions reaching out to their networks.

Themes:

- Letter Box and Contact- Moving to Digital approach and how to support Adopters
- Transitions, Identity and Life Story-Considering the support needed to ensure families to help their children
- Therapy, Education and training support reviews— Consulting on adopters preference and needs
- Communication—Supporting RAA and Adopters to develop supportive relationships, peer support events and newsletter/website reviews
- Universal Adoption support Offer- What should be included from a families point of view
- The Adoption Journey- Collecting views on what Adopter's wish they had know and how RAAs can plan to ensure this is place for other adopters starting their Journey
